

The Treasure Box Curricular Connections

Primary (Kindergarten)

- English Language Arts: Engage with stories to understand personal experiences and emotions.
- **Social Studies:** Recognize that families and communities have unique histories.
- Health & Physical Education: Identify feelings and ways to express them.

Grade 1

- English Language Arts: Make personal connections to texts and share experiences.
- Social Studies: Explore how families and communities change over time.
- **Health & Physical Education:** Recognize and express emotions in healthy ways.

Grade 2

- English Language Arts: Understand how stories help us learn about ourselves and others.
- Social Studies: Examine how traditions and heritage shape identity.
- Health & Physical Education: Demonstrate strategies for resolving conflicts.

- English Language Arts: Ask and respond to questions to deepen understanding of stories.
- **Social Studies:** Investigate the experiences of different cultural groups in Canada.
- **Health & Physical Education:** Identify ways to build positive relationships with others.
- Science: Explore how people adapt to environmental and social changes.

Grade 4

- English Language Arts: Use storytelling to explore identity and personal experiences.
- Social Studies: Analyze how people from different cultures have shaped communities.
- **Health & Physical Education:** Identify strategies for dealing with stress and change.
- Science: Explore the relationships between people and their environments over time.

Grade 5

- English Language Arts: Examine how literature reflects personal and social issues.
- **Social Studies:** Investigate historical and contemporary migration in Canada.
- **Health & Physical Education:** Recognize how relationships impact well-being.
- Science: Understand how environmental changes influence communities.

- English Language Arts: Recognize how literary elements and storytelling techniques create meaning in texts.
- Social Studies: Analyze the experiences of immigrants and refugees in historical and contemporary contexts.
- **Health & Physical Education:** Explore strategies for building and maintaining positive friendships.
- Science: Investigate how environmental and historical changes influence human migration.

Grade 7

- English Language Arts: Assess how identity, culture, and history shape perspectives in literature.
- **Social Studies:** Examine human migration and its impact on communities, including forced and voluntary relocation.
- **Health & Physical Education:** Understand the effects of bullying and develop conflict resolution strategies.
- Science: Explore the impact of environmental factors on human settlements and survival.

Grade 8

- English Language Arts: Analyze how characters' experiences reflect broader historical and social issues.
- Social Studies: Investigate historical events that have influenced migration patterns and cultural identities.
- **Health & Physical Education:** Examine the role of peer relationships and inclusivity in mental well-being.
- Science: Analyze how historical climate events have shaped human movement and adaptation.

- **English Language Arts:** Evaluate how personal and historical narratives shape identity and understanding.
- **Social Studies:** Assess the impact of historical migration on individuals and societies.
- **Health & Physical Education:** Explore resilience and strategies to navigate change and adversity.
- Science: Investigate how natural disasters and environmental change have influenced human migration.

Grade 10

- English Language Arts: Critically analyze themes of identity and belonging in literature.
- Social Studies: Examine historical and contemporary global migration patterns.
- Health & Physical Education: Assess the effects of discrimination and social exclusion.
- Science: Explore the relationship between climate change and human displacement.

Grade 11

- English Language Arts: Analyze how literature reflects cultural and historical experiences.
- Social Studies (History): Evaluate the causes and consequences of forced migration throughout history.
- **Health & Physical Education:** Examine the impact of adversity on personal development.
- Science: Investigate how environmental challenges have shaped human movement over time.

- English Language Arts: Evaluate how storytelling preserves history and shapes cultural identity.
- Social Studies (Global History/Sociology): Analyze the role of migration in shaping societies and cultural heritage.
- **Health & Physical Education:** Assess the importance of resilience in overcoming life challenges.
- Science (Environmental Science): Explore how human populations adapt to environmental changes and challenges.
